My father went to church for the first time when he was a child. His younger sister, my aunt, went to church before him for Vacation Bible School. She loved it and invited my father, saying it was so much fun. Ever since he grew in faith. I am not sure who started but my paternal grandparents and all the aunts and uncles have been Christians. My maternal grandmother built the first Methodist Church in Jeju Island with other Korean war refugees. She had six children and raised them in faith. My parents met in a church. They were in the same young adult group and the choir. My mother often sang hymns at home, and my father told me Bible stories. They never skipped Sunday worship services as far as I know and participated in the early morning services, Wednesday services, Friday prayer gatherings and the small group gatherings. The church was almost everything to them. Thanks to them, I grew up in the church, learning about God and growing in faith. They passed down their faith to me.

The church has been a huge part of my life since I was very young. I volunteered in many aspects of ministries, but after I began to serve a small local church as a pastor, I was finally was able to see the whole church. I took care of the children ministry, youth group, young adult group and the adult ministries. As I learned more and more and served longer and longer, my perspective on ministry grew. Right before the Pandemic, I happened to read a book, "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations" written by Robert Schnase (Abingdon, 2018). I was deeply impacted by the book. It introduces practices that can help the church can become vital and fruitful. When I read the book, my heart was pounding just like when I read the book of Acts. The church is not a social club but people who gathered in Jesus' name and entails missions to save lives and make differences. Together, the church has a power through the Holy Spirit to do things that individuals can barely do. Schnase wrote that fruitful churches are practicing, "Radical Hospitality," "Passionate Worship," "Intentional Faith Development," "Risk-Taking Mission and Service" and "Extravagant Generosity." This fall, I would like to encourage you to read this book. I will share these practices through our sermon series. But if you can read it with me and ponder more about it through worship, I believe God will do something amazing through us even though we don't see it today.

On the first Sunday of September, we will share passing down our faith, and then our beautiful children Henry, Oliver and Emmarie Asher will be baptized. Then beginning the second Sunday, we will share the five practices of Fruitful Congregations. May God touch our hearts through the Holy Spirit so we can become a more vital church and make a difference for the kingdom of God!
